b. Programme Structure: Present the Programme as a coherent 60 credit add-on programme rather than as a combination of two Minor Awards.

a. The panel noted that the proposed 10 credit Minor Awards are already validated 10 credit modules (currently being offered as part of an already validated 40 credit Minor Award). The Panel recommends that the Programme Team review their strategy in creating two additional Minor Awards rather than offering single subject certificates.

b. The Programme Team should prepare the relevant programme documentation if Minor Awards are being proposed and submit to the Panel for review.
