Response by School: Ongoing industry engagement with guest lectures by relevant Logistics and SCM practitioners arranged. Linking students with other seminars and guest lectures arranged within the Faculty. Site visits are being explored.

Enhance the Student Handbook by:

- Including a graphic on the place of the programme and how it fits with other programmes and the career progression opportunities available. – *Included in Handbook*
- Providing a table which shows which modules are included in each semester, who is teaching the module and what school they are in or if industry practitioners and if any guest lecturers are envisaged. - Providing more information in the Student Handbook on the use of site visits and industry engagement on the programme – Site visits referenced in the Handbook
- Providing more details on the approach to equality, diversity and inclusivity.-Links to TU Dublins Equality, diversity and inclusivity included in Handbook.
