Our focus is on prevention, early intervention and fighting poverty. Our program works to: • improve developmental outcomes for children, with a priority focus on children aged 0-6 years. • develop effective referral pathways between services. • support improvements in the quality and standard of service delivery in Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) services, schools and community organizations.
Ongoing	CRAWL- (Campuses Role as Actors in Walkable and Liveable Communities)- a project to understand and address the impacts of an increased the reliance on cars for many, with newer communities suffering from a lack of amenities within walking distance. It has received funding from Science Foundation Ireland's National Challenge Fund Sustainable Communities Challenge.
January 2024	Free Entrepreneurship Programme for Young People in the North East Inner City- Lasting 10 weeks, a combination of TU Dublin GROWTHhub, the Dublin NEIC Task Force, Inner City Enterprise, the Open Doors Initiative, and Dogpatch Labs. The programme's key objective is to help student prepare for a career in entrepreneurship by helping them to develop their idea, sell their product and finance their business.
February 2024	TU Dublin Entrepreneurship Course for Refugees- online course open to those who have refugee or asylum seeker status with a mentorship program delivered through the Open Doors Initiative.
February 2024	TU Rise secures 13.6 million euro announced by Minister for Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science, Simon Harris TD. This project stretches from 2024- 2028 to engage with over 200
