

TU Dublin Statement on Fossil Fuels

November 2020

As a university with over 30,000 students and staff and with our foundation in education provision starting over 140 years ago, we at TU Dublin recognise our special role in helping to address the challenges of climate change and sustainability. As an organisation we are working towards ensuring that all students graduate from TU Dublin with a greater understanding of the sustainability challenges and possess the expertise and commitment to help find solutions for tomorrow's generations. The University aims to build and operate its campuses as living labs that support teaching, research and innovation and that contribute to the well-being of every member of its immediate and extended community - and ultimately to the health of the planet.

As part of this, to accelerate the transition to a zero-carbon economy, TU Dublin has agreed to:-

- 1. Make no new investments in the top 200 oil, gas, and coal companies.*
- 2. Sell any existing investments tied to these oil, gas, and coal investments within 3-5 years.*
- 3. Invest in climate solutions, such as renewable energy, energy efficiency, sustainable agriculture, water efficiency and more*
