
Bay Section



Structrual Plan





Exposed Structural Stauntons






Peter Rice first visited the site of Kansai International Airport together with Renzo Piano and Noriaki Okabe in September 1988. By then the island's 11 kilometre bounding walls were largely in place, revealing the size and shape to the three men sitting in the boat, where the island had yet to apper. Lingering traces of the form of the waves and the glistening of the sun on the water might perhaps be detected in the final building. Sadly, Rice died tragically in 1992 at the peak of his career aged 57. Kansai Airport was his last project but unfortunately he did not get to see it to completion as the airport was completed and opened to public in 1994.


