Hourly Paid Assistant Lecturers (HPALs) Panel: Ideally applicants should have three years expertise in Chemistry or BioPharmaceutical at postgraduate level and experience in laboratory-based teaching and should have availability for 2 to 3 days per week from September 15th to June 20th with breaks as per the TU Dublin academic calendar.

The hours available would mainly involve supervising year 1 and 2 undergraduate laboratory practicals as well as the possibility of giving some first-year tutorials on our Grangegorman and Tallaght Campus. Payment is at a rate of €67.81 per teaching hour.

There are also a <u>panel</u> for <u>Senior Demonstrator</u>: This could suit early career researchers at postgraduate level and ideally applicants should have availability 2 to 3 days per week from September 15th to June 20th with breaks as per the TU Dublin academic calendar.

Senior Demonstrators assist an academic staff member or hourly paid assistant lecturer in the running and supervision of undergraduate chemistry laboratories on our Grangegorman and Tallaght Campus. Payment is at a rate of €34.06 per teaching hour.
