## Bachelor of Music Orchestral Studies

The BMus programme is designed for students who wish to develop their performance skills to a high level to suit a variety of contexts. Based at the Conservatoire, the BMus offers multiple pathways to allow students to focus on their strengths.

The Conservatoire aims to provide a positive music-making experience for all music undergraduates whilst nurturing important aspects of academic music which combine to produce a well-rounded musician, capable of being employed in a wide variety of music contexts and scenarios.

### What will I study as an Orchestral student?

The core activity is the principal study instrumental lesson which is 1 hour per week with a 1 hour group lesson.

Students work closely with their principal study teacher (one-to-one) to develop their interpretative and technical skills.

A weekly orchestral performance class brings all orchestral students together in a forum designed to develop performance experience alongside critical evaluation and listening skills.

Students also have weekly sessions of ensemble and chamber music. Each orchestral student is assigned an accompanist with whom they collaborate and rehearse on a weekly basis.

The BMus is the ideal programme for students who wish to pursue a practical music course in performance, pedagogy or composition.
