These programmes are offered over three years (Level 7), and over four years (Level 8), on a full-time basis.

They are broad general business degrees with an applied focus on hospitality & tourism. In years 1-3, students take modules in food & beverage, front office, tourism, IT, accounting, economics, human resources, marketing, and law. In year four, modules are offered in business planning, entrepreneurship, corporate social responsibility, and content management.

An Erasmus semester abroad is offered as an option in year two, semester four. Additionally, students are required to undertake an international placement in year three, semester five. Students are assisted in sourcing placements with the guidance of the placement co-ordinator.

Both programmes are designed to enhance and add to the level of professionalism in the hospitality and tourism industry while also contributing to developing the business and professional acumen of individuals at management level.

Our Tallaght campus, based on the South West Dublin, is home to over 5,000 students. The campus is located on an 18-hectare site between Old Blessington Road, Belgard Road and Greenhills Road in Tallaght Dublin 24.

The campus is fully equipped with lecture theatres comprising of the latest audiovisual equipment and learning aids, science, electronic and computer labs, state-of-the-art culinary kitchens, restaurant, library, canteen, coffee shop, students' union area, and a soccer pitch. The campus also offers free parking for cars and bikes.

Construction on a €14.7 million Sports Science, Health and Recreation building on Campus has just finished, providing an additional 3,282 m2 of space. This new building comprises of teaching laboratories incorporating a fitness suite and exercise medicine laboratory, a sports hall, two lecture theatres, three classrooms and a grass playing pitch.

The Campus is easily accessible using the Red Luas Line. A range of cross city Dublin Bus routes stop outside the campus, including the 54A, 27, 65, 49, 77A, 75, 56A, 76, 76A.
