

#### 4.4. Attendance at lectures

Each module (see syllabus) describes the contact hours and self-study associated with that module. Contact hours may include onsite (in-person) events, online synchronous (live) events which take place at specified date(s) and time(s) or online asynchronous (recorded) events. Details of these events will be provided via your timetable, Year Tutor and individual module lecturer. It is expected that students will attend **all** lectures, tutorials, laboratory sessions and assessments both in-person and online. It is the student's responsibility to ensure that they are available for these elements. The workload described for each module is proportional to the credits awarded (ECTS) but individual students may need to commit themselves to working more (perhaps using additional resources from the library or online or suggested by the lecturer) on elements that they find most taxing.

Students are not permitted to record (either audio or video) or take pictures of lectures or distribute course material. Exceptional circumstances (e.g. a disability registered with the University) that requires non-standard methods of attending lectures or receiving lecture material need to be informed to the Year Tutor who will discuss any necessary accommodations.
