Katie Holly is the owner and Managing Director of Dublin-based Keeper Pictures, where she has produced several award winning and critically acclaimed features including Mike Ahern and Enda Loughman's EXTRA ORDINARY starring Maeve Higgins and Will Forte, Academy Award Nominee Whit Stillman's LOVE & FRIENDSHIP starring Kate Beckinsale and Chloe Sevigny, which was nominated for a Golden Globe; Conor Horgan's THE QUEEN OF IRELAND about activist and icon Panti Bliss and Sophie Fiennes' GRACE JONES: BLOODLIGHT & BAMI. Her films have screened at festivals including Sundance, Berlinale, Tribeca, SXSW, Toronto, New York, London, Rotterdam, Karlovy Vary and Sydney.

#### LARA HICKEY

Lara Hickey is an award winning Irish producer based in Dublin. She has had her work selected internationally at over 75 festivals, broadcast on RTÉ, Virgin Media and Canal+, and was nominated for two IFTA Awards and appeared on the longlist for the Academy Awards with two short films, most recently with the Screen Ireland Focus Short LAMB by Sinéad O'Loughlin, which had its World Premiere at Tribeca Film Festival in New York. Also in 2023, Lara released BURN IT ALL written & directed by Jack Hickey, which won the Donal Gilligan Award for Best Cinematography at Galway Film Fleadh and the Best Irish Short Film award at Kerry International Film Festival, and sold to Canal+; and GOOD CHIPS by



Nell Hensey and Brigid Leahy, which won the Virgin Media Discovers award, in association with Screen Ireland and had its world premiere at Dublin International Film Festival and was broadcast on Virgin Media One.

Lara has just wrapped on SEPTEMBER SAYS, the debut feature film by Ariane Labed, producing for Element Pictures, a co-production between Element Pictures (Ireland), Match Factory (Germany) and Crybaby (UK), and funded by BBC Film, BFI UK Global Screen Fund, Creative Europe and Eurimages. PARK, her first feature film, premiered at Toronto IFF and San Sebastian IFF, where it won the New Directors Award. Since then, it has participated and won awards in numerous international film festivals. Her sophomore film, ANIMAL, was selected and participated in L'Atelier (Festival de Cannes) and Mia Roma



Market. In August 2023, ANIMAL premiered at Locarno IFF, where it won the Award for Best Performance. ANIMAL also won Best Film Award at Thessaloniki IFF, Cork IFF and Vancouver IFF plus numerous other awards in various festivals such as Best Performance Award at Les Arcs FF and Thessaloniki IFF, Fipresci Award at Mannheim IFF.

Paula Heffernan has been Head of Production for Element Pictures, one of the leading production companies in Ireland, since 2016, working across the company's slate of film and television productions and co-productions.

Prior to joining Element, Paula received a BSc in Communications, Film and Broadcasting from Dublin Institute of Technology, and worked as a Production Manager on light entertainment and current affairs television. She began working in Element in 2007 as PA to Company Directors Ed Guiney and Andrew Lowe, quickly



progressing to the role of Production Executive. She was also Series Producer on two series of Element's continuing drama RED ROCK (80 x 30min eps per series).

During her time on RED ROCK, Paula helped to design and implement a Writers Academy and Director Shadowing Scheme, the latter particularly aimed at bringing more female directing talent into television drama.

During her time in Element, Paula has worked on over 70 feature film and TV drama projects, including Academy Award nominees POOR THINGS, THE FAVOURITE and ROOM. She has shot projects in a variety of locations including the US, Canada, Hungary, Czechia, and Zambia. Current productions include KINDS OF KINDNESS by Yorgos Lanthimos, Rungano Nyoni's second feature film, ON BECOMING A GUINEA FOWL, Ariane Labed's debut feature SEPTEMBER SAYS, and Nancy Harris' THE DRY Season 2.

#### **MAEVE STONE**

Maeve Stone is a director and writer for film and theatre, whose work responds to issues of climate breakdown, and revisits the canon with a feminist lens. She is founder and lead artist of Axis Ballymun's Green Arts Department and just completed an artivistin-residence with Project Arts Centre. She co-founded Cracking Light Productions with partner Alex Gill in 2021 and through a series of Arts Council awards has created work that builds connections between people, place and nature. In 2023 she and actors Aoibheann McCann and Liv O'Donoghue made a short called THE LAST HARVEST that looks at mothering in a hundred



years. THE LAST HARVEST was a pilot project in sustainable short filmmaking supported by Clare County Council and resulted in a detailed documentary and report of the process.

## **OONAGH KEARNEY**

Oonagh Kearney is a writer and director from Cork. With a BA in English and Philosophy from University College Cork and M.Phil in Irish Theatre from Trinity College Dublin, Oonagh's passion for story began in the theatre. Her interest in screenwriting and directing was sparked when she got the job as casting director to Ken Loach on his Palme d'Or winning THE WIND THAT SHAKES THE BARLEY in 2005. After graduating from the National Film and Television School in London, Oonagh wrote and directed nine award-winning dramatic/experimental shorts, a feature doc WONDER HOUSE and a TV pilot (with the support of Screen Ireland, the Arts Council, RTÉ, TG4, BRITDOC and Wellcome Trust).



For television, Oonagh recently directed OBITUARY (Eps 4,5 & 6), a new TV series for RTÉ/Hulu/AMC/Tua Films and VARDY V ROONEY: A COURTROOM DRAMA for Channel 4/Chalkboard TV, starring Michael Sheen, which was nominated for Best Drama Mini Series at the British Press Guild Awards in 2022, and Best Debut Director at the New Voices Awards in London in 2023. Oonagh also directed 2nd Unit for Dearbhla Walsh on the award-winning first series of BAD SISTERS for Apple TV/Merman.

Over the years, Oonagh has participated in several international training initiatives such as Berlinale Talents, She Writes, Screen Yorkshire's Triangle Scheme, the Apulia Experience,









Torino TFL TV Labs, Sources 2 Feature Film Development, UK Guiding Lights and the UGC Writers Campus at Series Mania. Oonagh's feature screenplay SNOW ON BEARA won her a place on the Athena IRIS Screenplay Lab in NYC, BBC Drama Writers Room in London and EWA Screenwriting Residency in Berlin, and is now in development with EZ Films and Creative Europe. Oonagh's feature film VIRTUOSO and TV series NOTIONS are in development with Keeper Pictures, Screen Ireland and RTÉ.

As director, Oonagh has just completed a new short film NEVER KILL A FEMBOY ON THE FIRST DATE written by Lee-Loi Chieng and produced by Aoibhín Murphy of Newgrange Pictures for Virgin Media Discovers. It will premiere at Dublin International Film Festival on February 24th 2024 and thereafter will be available to watch online.

Ursula Rani Sarma is a Writer, Director and Executive Producer for TV, Film and Theatre of Irish/Indian descent. Her credits include BODKIN (Netflix/Higher Ground/Wiip), SMOTHER (Treasure/BBC Studios/ RTÉ), DELICIOUS (Sky One/Bandit), RED ROCK (Element/TV3) and RAW (Ecosse/RTÉ) amongst others. Ursula is currently creating a new TV Drama for Sister Pictures and the BBC, which she is also Lead Writing and Exec Producing, as well as developing new work for Netflix, Smokehouse, Carvinal, and Eon Productions amongst others. IN THE SHADOWS, a feature film written by Ursula and based on the life of boxer Ramla Ali will be



shot later this year and stars Letitia Wright in the lead role. IN THE SHADOWS will be directed by Anthony Wonke and is produced by Lee Magiday (THE FAVOURITE) for Sleeper Films and was developed with the assistance of Film4.









Ursula is also developing a feature film TURLOUGH which she will write and also direct for Treasure Entertainment, supported by Screen Ireland. Before writing for the screen, Ursula worked in the theatre for many years and has written numerous plays including: A THOUSAND SPLENDID SUNS, YERMA, THE DARK THINGS and EVENING TRAIN, a musical with music by Mick Flannery. Her plays have been produced around the world, extensively translated and are published by Oberon, Faber and Faber, Nick Hern and Penguin Random House. Ursula is currently developing new theatre pieces for The Abbey Theatre and The Royal National Theatre London.

Ursula was the Programme Leader of the MA in Scriptwriting at Bath Spa University for ten years and continues to mentor and support emerging artists at home and abroad.

Since forming Deadpan Pictures with Paul Donovan in 2014, Ailish Elmeel and Paul have produced some of the most critically acclaimed TV shows to come out of Ireland, including CAN'T COPE WON'T COPE, and DEAD STILL, establishing Deadpan Pictures as the comedy drama production company in Ireland.

Ailish is currently in pre-production on VIDEO NASTY a darkly comic horror coming of age drama series for BBC, WDR, Virgin Media and Boat Rocker. Recent series include NORTHERN LIGHTS for TG4, Streamz and ZDFNeo in association with Screen Ireland



and Lionsgate TV. THE SOUTH WESTERLIES, a 6 x 1 hour ratings hit for both RTÉ and Acorn. Previous productions include WOMEN ON THE VERGE, a co-production with Merman for UKTV and RTÉ, the critically acclaimed CAN'T COPE WON'T COPE for RTÉ / Netflix / BBC3. NOWHERE FAST for RTÉ and the multi-award winning web series, BURNING WISHES. Ailish also produced the feature film HALAL DADDY (2017) under Deadpan.

Ailish is a graduate of Inside Pictures 2019, TransAtlantic Partners 2013, EAVE 2007 and holds a diploma from UCLA in Film Development and a B.Sc in Film and Broadcasting from DIT. She was a founding board member of the Irish Chapter of Women in Film and Television.

Ella Glendining is a disabled Writer/Director. IS THERE ANYBODY OUT THERE? premiered at Sundance 2023, and has won awards including the Silver Horn for the director of a film on social issues at Krakow Film Festival 2023, the prestigious FIPRESCI International Film Critics Prize, and the Bring the Change award at Biografilm Festival 2023. Ella also secured two 2023 BIFA nominations, Best Debut Director – Documentary Feature, and The Raindance Maverick Award. Ella was one of three recipients of the BFI and Chanel Filmmaker awards 2023, celebrating 'creative audacity', and was named a BAFTA Breakthrough 2023. Ella is currently writing a historical drama feature she will also direct for the BFI, called CURIOSITIES OF FOOLS.

Aoife Kelleher is an award-winning film and television director. Her debut documentary feature film, ONE MILLION DUBLINERS was described as "entertaining, thought-provoking and poignant" (RTÉ Guide); "beautifully filmed" (The Irish Times) and "all you need in a film" (Film Ireland). It received numerous awards, including Best Irish Feature Documentary at the Galway Film Fleadh, Best Irish Feature Documentary at the Sky Road Film & TV Festival, Best Irish Film of 2014 by The Irish Times, the Gold Medal for Best Television at the Sandford St. Martin Awards, a Silver Medal for Documentary at the New York Festivals World's Awards, Best Factual at the Celtic Media Awards and an IFTA award.



In 2018, Aoife was IFTA-nominated for Best Director for the RTÉ documentary, WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT DAD.

Her critically acclaimed RTÉ documentary series, GROWING UP GAY, was described as "superbly made" (The Irish Times) and "groundbreaking" (Irish Independent) and was awarded Best Television Series at the 2010 Entertainment.ie awards. Her short











documentary film, HOME, was awarded Best Documentary at the Fastnet Short Film Festival.

Her radio documentary, THE CASE OF MAJELLA MOYNIHAN broadcast on RTÉ Radio One in June 2019, won Best Documentary at the IMRO Radio Awards 2020. The documentary also received a Gold Medal at the New York Festivals Radio Awards and a Special Commendation at the Prix Europa 2019.

Along with Majella Moynihan, Aoife wrote Majella's memoir, A GUARDED LIFE, which was published by Hachette in 2020 and was nominated for an Irish Book Award.



Aoife continues to leave an indelible mark in visual arts, seamlessly transitioning between film, TV, music videos and commercials and is currently focusing on developing several feature films.


