Note 1. The minimum IELTS requirement is overall 5.0 for all programmes. Progression to some programmes may require a higher level so please contact the Programme Coordinator to confirm the level required. Commence undergraduate programme the following September.

Note 2: There are international bridging programmes for undergraduate, postgraduate and PhD preparation. The IELTS entry requirement is 0.5 of a band less than the direct entry requirement. This is overall 6 for most programmes. Upon successful completion of the programme you are guaranteed a place on your destination programme of choice. No further IELTS is required.

What is the International Foundation Programme?

The International Foundation Programme (IFP) is a one year programme run by TU Dublin. It has been developed for international students who need language and/or academic preparation for further study on undergraduate programmes in Ireland. Upon successful completion of the programme and International Foundation Certificate (Special Purpose Award, Level 6, 60 ECTS Credits) will be awarded by TU Dublin and you will be guaranteed a place on your undergraduate programme of choice at TU Dublin.

What is the International Bridging Programme?

The International Bridging Programme at TU Dublin is an intensive 8 week programme developed especially for international students who need further English language preparation to progress to their undergraduate studies at TU Dublin. If you have already met the academic requirements for direct entry and just need to further improve your English, it is the ideal pathway for you.

Advanced Entry

Advanced entry is available to some of our courses offered at TU Dublin and applications will open in November 2024. Availability of places will be only confirmed at the end of April 2025 and you will be notified after this date.

English Language Requirement

Undergraduate applicants whose first language is not English may be required to provide evidence of English language proficiency. The table below includes the English language proficiency tests and results which are acceptable for most programmes at undergraduate level. The certificate of your English language standard must have been issued within 2 years of the expected start of your course.

Undergraduate applicants who can verify that they have studied their school-leaving exams through English (e.g. A-Levels, SATs) but have not taken English as an examined language may also meet English language proficiency requirements. Note: where an undergraduate programme has a specific English entry requirement (e.g. TU985 Journalism), applicants must meet this requirement or equivalent.

In relation to IELTS, the minimum score is 6.0 with no less than 6 in each component unless otherwise stated. Please be aware that some programmes require a higher score. Details can be found on individual programme pages.

* Applicants will be advised of and must submit a portfolio.

Business

TU910 – BSc in Accounting (Level 8)

A 3–4 year honours degree located at Aungier Street, geared towards professional accountancy careers. It prepares students for roles in finance, corporate accountancy, and fund management, often leading to training contracts with firms.

TU912 – BSc in Business Analytics

A four year programme at Aungier Street blending statistical data analysis, business management, and computational thinking. Graduates are well-equipped for roles like data analyst, BI analyst, or IT consultant.

TU965 – BA (Hons) in International Business & Languages

A four year dual-discipline degree at Aungier Street that combines international business studies with language proficiency. Ideal for careers in global trade, market expansion, and consultancy.

IT & Digital

TU863 – BSc in Digital Forensics & Cyber Security

Based at Blanchardstown, this degree covers digital investigation, cyber threat analysis, and network security. Graduates are prepared for roles in cyber security, threat intelligence, and forensic investigation.

TU862 – BSc (Hons) in Computing with Machine Learning & AI

A fulltime four year programme at Tallaght integrating computing, AI, data science and business intelligence. Includes a sixmonth industry placement with leading tech firms.

TU850 – BSc (Hons) in Data Science & Artificial Intelligence

Based at Grangegorman, this course combines foundational computer science with advanced skills in AI, data analysis, and machine learning. Designed for careers in both tech and business sectors.

Health Sciences

TU864 – BSc (Hons) in DNA & Forensic Analysis

A Tallaght based degree combining biological and chemical sciences with hands on forensic and DNA fingerprinting training. Prepares graduates for roles in biotechnology, clinical research, and quality assurance.



TU871 – BSc (Hons) in Optometry

Delivered at Grangegorman, this is a four year professional programme offering clinical and theoretical training in eye care. Students train in TU Dublin's National Optometry Centre and undertake external placements.



TU872 – BSc (Hons) in Public Health Nutrition

This four-year degree equips students with the skills to promote health and prevent disease through nutrition. Combining science, policy, and communication, it prepares graduates to work in public health settings, community outreach, or health promotion, with a strong emphasis on tackling nutrition-related health inequalities.



TU936 – BSc (Hons) in Sport Science and Health

This dynamic four-year degree explores the science behind athletic performance and physical well-being. Students study areas like physiology, biomechanics, and nutrition, alongside practical lab work and placements. Graduates are prepared for roles in sport performance, health promotion, rehabilitation, or further study in allied health professions. TU872 – Public Health Nutrition

Creative Arts & Design



TU974 – BA (Hons) Fine Art

A four year honours art programme at Grangegorman nurturing studio practice, conceptual thinking, and portfolio development.

TU811 – BSc (Hons) Product Design

Spanning Aungier Street, Bolton Street and Grangegorman, this vocational design degree emphasizes industrial design, prototypes, and creative problem-solving.



TU975 – BA (Hons) Interior Design

Based at Grangegorman, this course explores spatial design, exhibition development, and interiors through practical studio work.

TU963 – BMus (Hons) Music

A four year music degree at Grangegorman focusing on performance, composition, and music technology.

Aungier Street

Our Aungier Street campus, one of three Dublin City Centre locations in the heart of South Dublin, specialises in business related courses.

The campus, located on a 26,000sqm site on Aungier Street in Dublin 2, is built on the historical site of the former Jacob's factory. The campus is close to the Green Luas line stop at St Stephen's Green and a range of cross-city Dublin Bus routes stop outside the campus, including the 14, 15, 16, 65, 140 and 142. The campus is a five minute walk from Dame Street, which is also serviced by a multitude of bus routes.

The Aungier Street campus is planned to relocate to Grangegorman following completion of the West Quad, currently estimated for the end of 2029. Students beginning their programmes in 2026 are expected to complete their studies at Aungier Street.

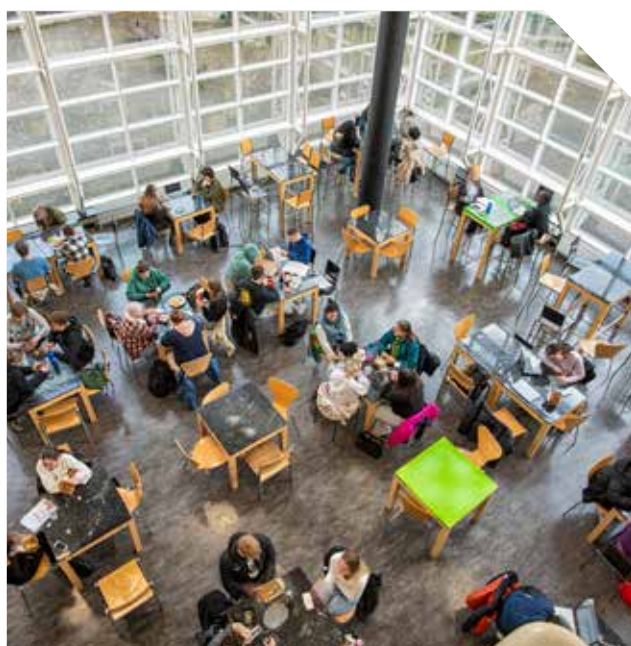
Tallaght

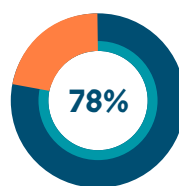

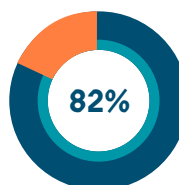

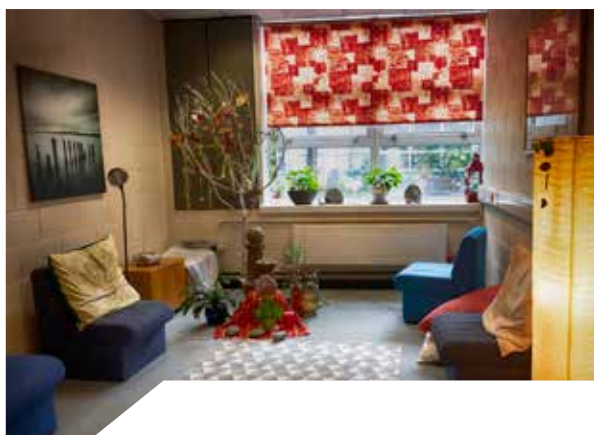
Student Health Centres

Global Standards in International Education

TU Dublin is proud to be part of a global community of universities committed to excellence in international education. As an institution that aligns with the values of the Council of International Schools (CIS), we uphold high standards in academic quality, student welfare, and global engagement. Our participation in international admissions networks, Erasmus+ mobility, and the European University of Technology (EUt+) alliance reflects our deep commitment to creating a welcoming and supportive environment for international students. We work closely with schools, counsellors, and families to ensure a smooth transition from secondary to higher education, with a focus on personalised support, practical learning, and real-world career outcomes.

Age Requirements

EEA and Swiss entrants admitted to TU Dublin must normally be seventeen years of age by 1 January following entry. However, the Registrar may grant dispensation for younger students to be admitted. All international entrants (entrants from outside the EEA and Switzerland) must be 18 years old by the 31st of December for September intakes and 18 years old by 31st of March for January intakes. Under-18 international students are required to provide proof of guardianship in advance of registration.

The Registrar can make an exception with regard to the age limit of Irish/EU entrants, but International Entrants must meet the age guidelines. They must also be able to provide proof of guardianship, which as you correctly stated in your email, TU Dublin cannot facilitate.

Health Insurance

All International (Non-EU/EEA) Students registering with TU Dublin will need to purchase their own private medical health insurance, as required by the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Services (INIS). The insurance policy must cover you from the date you arrive in Ireland until the date you leave. This is an important document to have when you land and when you go to your immigration appointment.



Fees at TU Dublin

If you hold an Irish, EEA, or UK passport but have lived outside Europe, you are normally charged international non-EU tuition fees at TU Dublin. To support globally mobile families like yours, we offer a reduced and consistent annual tuition plan that spreads costs more evenly over four years

This scheme provides a saving of approximately 20% over the full duration of your degree, making it more affordable for students planning to fund their studies through loans or self-funding their education.

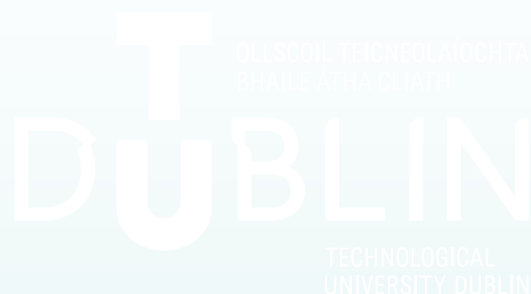
