Content

The Programme consists of four sections/modules that can be complete in any order:

Module 1 - Basic Principles of Maths and Physics
Applicable to Accident Reconstruction

Module 2 - Motor Vehicle Legislation as Related to Insurance Principles

Module 3 - Principles and Practice of Motor Vehicle Damage Assessment.

Module 4 - Motor Insurance

Entry Requirements

Applicants must have or are working towards an automotive trade or technical qualification or currently are employed in motor insurance or the automotive industry. Refer to the IAEA website for requirements for membership to IAEA institute.

Examinations / Assessments

Students take the IAEA examinations in May/June each year.

Learning Outcome

Membership of the IAEA. Attain rounded knowledge of the requirements of a motor vehicle assessor in the areas of Insurance, Law, Vehicle Inspection and Accident Reconstruction.
