Our Aungier Street campus, one of three Dublin City Centre locations in the heart of South Dublin, specalises in business related courses.

The campus, located on a 26,000sqm site on Aungier Street in Dublin 2, is built on the historical site of the former Jacob's factory. The campus is close to the Green Luas line stop at St Stephen's Green and a range of cross-city Dublin Bus routes stop outside the campus, including the 14, 15, 16, 65, 140 and 142. The campus is a five minute walk from Dame Street, which is also serviced by a multitude of bus routes.

The Aungier Street campus is planned to relocate to Grangegorman following completion of the West Quad, currently estimated for the end of 2029. Students beginning their programmes in 2026 are expected to complete their studies at Aungier Street.





Our Tallaght campus, based in South West Dublin, is home to over 5,000 students. The campus is located on an 18-hectare site between Old Blessington Road, Belgard Road and Greenhills Road in Tallaght, Dublin 24.



Mature Students

Whatever your reason for coming back to education, to update your skills, gain a new qualification, achieve a personal goal or ambition, etc. TU Dublin has a range of supports in place to help you decide what course to take, get through the application process and get settled into college life.



Who Qualifies as a Mature Student?

To be considered a mature student, you must:

- ─ Be 23 years of age or older on or before 1 January in the year you apply
- → Be an Irish or EU citizen

How to Apply?

Applications are assessed holistically, taking into account your academic background, work experience, and supporting documentation submitted with your CAO application.

Some applicants may be invited to complete a suitability test and/or interview, especially if they are not applying based on a Leaving Certificate or a QQI Level 5/6 award.

When writing your personal statement, consider addressing the following:

- → Any recent study or preparation for higher education
- Relevant work experience or training
- Your understanding of the challenges of full-time study (e.g. workload, finances, lifestyle changes)

Application Deadlines

We strongly recommend applying to the CAO by 1 February. Late applications (excluding restricted courses) are accepted up to 1 May, but availability is limited, especially for high demand courses.

Tertiary Education Programme

TU Dublin is proud to introduce a groundbreaking new degree programme as part of Ireland's National Tertiary Offering: Bachelor of Arts (Honours) in Politics, Society and Media.

Developed through a national collaboration between Further Education and Training (FET) and Higher Education (HE) providers, the tertiary programme offers a seamless route from local colleges into degree-level study.

This route is designed to make higher education more accessible with smaller class sizes, lower costs in the first two years and built-in support every step of the way.

Higher Education Access Route (HEAR)

HEAR is a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers who have experienced socioeconomic disadvantage. HEAR offers places at lower points to school leavers who, due to their socioeconomic background, have experienced additional educational challenges in second level education. Eligible applicants who are offered a place through the HEAR route will receive academic, personal and social supports in TU Dublin. For more information, check out accesscollege.ie/hear.

Disability Access Route to Education (DARE)

DARE is a third level alternative admissions scheme for school leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on their second level education.

DARE offers places at lower points to applicants who as a result of having a disability have experienced additional educational challenges in second level education. Once you have accepted your place, additional supports will be provided to assist you in your studies in TU Dublin. For more information, check out accesscollege.ie/dare.

Access TU Dublin

Access TU Dublin is a flexible entry route aimed at school leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds, who would like to study a full-time undergraduate course at TU Dublin. Eligible students are advised to apply for both the HEAR and Access TU Dublin entry routes. For more information visit tudublin.ie/access.

QQI Access TU Dublin

QQI Access TU Dublin, is an entry route aimed at students, from a socio-economically disadvantaged background, who have already completed a QQI Level 5 or 6 course and are applying to TU Dublin through the Higher Education Links Scheme (HELS). For more information visit tudublin.ie/access.

Access Foundation Programme

Our Access Foundation Programme (TU699) is a multidisciplinary one year full-time course that prepares students to pursue undergraduate study at TU Dublin. Students who successfully complete the course will be offered a place on an appropriate undergraduate course at the University.

We provide a wide variety of supports to help students adjust to university life so that you gain maximum benefit from your time with us. This course is not offered on the CAO, instead applications are made directly to TU Dublin. Further information on how to apply is available at tudublin.ie/access.

Advanced Entry

If you've got relevant qualifications or work experience, you may be eligible to start in Year 2 or later of an undergraduate course, this is called Advanced Entry.

Athlete Support Programme

The TU Dublin Athlete Support Programme is one of Ireland's most highly respected athlete support pathways. Designed to help talented students balance their academic and sporting commitments, the programme provides access to high-performance training, performance support services and academic mentoring.

In recognition of our commitment to dual career development, TU Dublin has again achieved ASAS Accreditation from the Sport Ireland Institute for the period 2024–2026. This year, over 300 elite athletes across 32 sports are being supported through our university-wide Athlete Support Programme.

How to Apply?

Applications for the Athlete Support Programme for the 2026-27 academic year open on 1 February 2026 and the closing date for receipt of applications is 1 June 2026 at 5:00pm.

Applicants must also apply for a TU Dublin course via the CAO and complete an Athlete Support Programme online application form.

Criteria

- Meet CAO admission requirements and register for a TU Dublin course, or be a current student
- Accept a TU Dublin course via the CAO and complete registration
- Compete at regional, county, national or international level in a Sport Ireland recognised sport
- Commit to representing TU Dublin in the relevant competitive pathway, where possible
- Maintain satisfactory academic and sporting performance to renew the scholarship annually

Moving from Level 6/7 to Level 8

If you're thinking about college but feeling unsure about the points or the pressure to get into a big university straight away, don't worry there's more than one way to get your degree. Unlike traditional universities, TU Dublin offers a flexible and supportive way to move from a Level 6 or Level 7 course to a full Level 8 degree, which is the same as a standard Honours Degree.


A More Flexible Path

Most universities in Ireland expect you to jump straight into a Level 8 course, which often means high points and a lot of pressure. TU Dublin does things differently. We understand that everyone learns at their own pace, and not everyone's journey is the same.

Here, you can start with a Level 6 (Higher Certificate) or Level 7 (Ordinary Degree) course. If you do well, you'll often be able to move straight into the third year of a related Level 8 course. It's like climbing a ladder, one step at a time instead of having to leap to the top

For instance, students who start with a Level 6 Higher Certificate or a Level 7 Ordinary Degree at TU Dublin have the opportunity on many courses to progress to a Level 8 Honours Degree. This progression is often seamless, with many students entering directly into the third year of a related Level 8 course, depending on their academic performance. This pathway not only enhances accessibility but also provides students with the time to mature academically and personally, setting them up for greater success at the Level 8 stage.

We support all our students, no matter where they come from or how they start. Whether you go straight into a Level 8 course or work your way up from Level 6 or 7, you'll be supported every step of the way both in your studies and in your personal growth.



Progression is only possible to Year 3 on some Level 8 courses.

Direct progression to Year 4 is dependent on exam results.

Fees at TU Dublin

Fees are set annually by the Department of Education. For 2025, most EU nationals starting their first full-time undergraduate course only need to pay the student contribution fee of €3,000* per year, if they meet residency requirements. This fee covers essential student services.

If you've already completed a third-level course, you may also be liable for tuition fees, depending on your previous study.

* Additional fees may be required for class equipment such as first aid, tool kits and culinary sets.



Financial Supports

The TU Dublin Foundation supports current TU Dublin students with a wide range of scholarships and awards thanks to generous donors, alumni and partners.

In the 2024-25 academic year so far, €205,654 has been awarded to 138 students across 45 different programmes. These supports help students stay focused on their studies, not financial stress.

- Scholarships: Typically based on financial need or personal dedication. Some offer up to €3,000 per year.
- **¬_ Awards:** Recognise exceptional academic or project work, usually €500 €1,000.

Open only to registered TU Dublin students, the application process is straightforward and may include a personal statement, portfolio, or interview.

SUSI (Student Universal Support Ireland)

SUSI grant applications open in April each year. You don't need to have applied to college to apply for a grant, so we recommend applying early.

Visit susi.ie in early 2026 to check opening dates and assess your eligibility.

One of the biggest decisions some students will have to make when you become a student is where you will live in Dublin. Finding a suitable place to stay while you study is essential, we are here to guide you through the available off-campus options and alternatives.

Choosing your Location

Our campuses are spread across Dublin, including the city centre, Blanchardstown, and Tallaght. When deciding where to live, it's important to consider transportation options (such as public transport, walking, or cycling routes), nearby amenities, housing costs, and the overall atmosphere of the area.

Before choosing your accommodation, use Google Maps to explore the available transport links to your campus. Living near your campus not only makes commuting more affordable and convenient, but it also supports sustainability and contributes positively to your student experience.

On-Campus Accommodation

Although we currently do not offer on-campus accommodation, we provide a wide range of host family and PBSA options to suit your needs.

Choosing the right accommodation can greatly enhance your university experience. If you have any questions or need assistance, feel free to reach out!



Important: Do not pay a deposit on any private rented accommodation until you have seen the accommodation in person or have asked someone known to you to visit the property. Use services like Secureprop for rental scam protection.



Host Family Accommodation

Host families offer rooms in their homes with flexible stays, ranging from 5 to 7 days a week, with options for shorter durations to meet different needs. Under our new rent cap policy, monthly rents range from €500 to €750. Payment is typically made for the weeks during the academic term.

- The cost includes utilities, so you won't need to transfer bills into your name
- Some host families provide a light breakfast or evening meal
- Tlexibility in start and end dates

Ideal for first-year students for reasons such as cost, comfort, security, and parents' peace of mind.

A warm, homely atmosphere makes it a great option for easing into independent living.

You can find host family accommodation on tudublinstudentpad.ie. Incoming students can register using '1234' as their student number but must email studentaccommodation@tudublin.ie for access confirmation. Before committing, always visit the home in person and never pay a deposit before meeting the host and viewing the room.

Purpose-Built Student Accommodation (PBSA)

PBSA offers a living experience designed specifically for students, fostering a supportive community for both academic and social well-being. TU Dublin has partnered with Mezzino Student Living, providing exclusive access to a selection of rooms in several prime city locations.




Róisín Norris - Planning and Environmental Management
